Book Project	Icarus Falls: The Psychology of Power in World Politics (in preparation).
	- Summary. Power is central to politics, but we have almost no explicit work on the psychological effects of power in international politics. Drawing on advances in psychological research on power, this book shows that the sense of relative state power – the intuitive feeling that "our state" is stronger than "your state" – inflates threat perception and activates overconfidence in the ability to solve these imagined fears through military force. Power paradoxically makes leaders worse at power politics. Together, the book provides a "first image reversed" challenge to standard "bottom-up" accounts of psychological IR, showing that decisionmakers are also a dependent variable shaped (and often corrupted) by relative power. The book has important implications for a world returning to great power competition.
